This will be an opportunity for current and former exchange teachers to spend a weekend in our province's capital city. The main purpose of this conference is to provide teachers with a chance for professional development through observation of a local school.

Partners and children of the exchange teachers are very welcome to attend all activities with the exception of Friday's school visits. A list of family friendly activities is attached for those who will be attending with their families.

*We wish to remind you that your exchange agreement includes professional development days. The Friday of our conference is intended to be one of them.

It's not too late to register and join us for the conference. Simply get permission from your principal to attend this ProD event and let us know your intention.

ACCOMMODATION

Unfortunately, we have no opportunities for billeting at this time. However, accommodation can be found at a variety of hotels in the downtown area. Tourism Victoria http://www.tourismvictoria.com/ can assist you in locating appropriate accommodation. A recent check on Booking.com shows hotels ranging from \$375-\$800 for 2 adults staying 3 nights. These hotels are all within a short walking distance of the Inner Habour which is a central point for our conference events. From last year's experience, some teachers found their accommodations through Airbnb and were delighted at the opportunity to explore other parts of the Victoria region.

Remember, as a school board employee, you may qualify for a government rate at some hotels.

If you are taking the ferry as a walk-on passenger, there is a bus that will take you from the ferry terminal to downtown Victoria. Some hotels include the shuttle in their price. Inquire when you are booking.

Conference events begin at 9am on May 12. A group dinner is planned on Saturday, May 13. Please keep this in mind when booking your accommodations.
